What we did to attain a Bronze Eco Church award

- Appointed an eco co-ordinator who carried out a survey of our current position
- Created an Environmental policy
- Created an action plan to achieve bronze level in each of the following categories

Worship and Teaching Category

- Embedded creation care in the preaching in our church
- Celebrate special days and seasons relating to creation care e.g. harvest
- Run courses and study groups that include creation care as an integral part of Christian faith
- Use sustainable worship resources e.g. local and home-grown floral arrangements etc
- Developed Noah's Ark teaching area for our youngsters
- Hosted guest speakers e.g. from SCOOP

Building and Energy Category

- Use appropriate energy tariffs
- LED lighting where possible
- We don't use gas or oil to heat the building
- Carry out planned maintenance
- Insulated pipework where possible
- Metered water supply
- Use eco cleaning products and toilet rolls
- Recycle church waste where possible

Land and Nature Category

- Developed the side garden into a wildlife garden with pollinator plants, wildflowers and a few weeds!
- Installed a bug hotel, a bird box, a log pile and a water bowl for wildlife
- Avoid pesticides and use natural fertiliser
- We use a water butt to catch rainwater
- We will take part in the Big Butterfly Count (July 2025)
- Organise a beach clean (September 2025)

Community & Global Engagement Category

- Working with Presbytery's Sustainability group and Jersey's Care for Creation group
- Promote community groups e.g. SCOOP
- Promote A Rocha's Target 25 campaign and citizen science we are focussing on the decline in butterflies
- Bank and invest the church's money with providers with climate friendly policies

- Use Fairtrade products in our refreshments
- Where possible eliminate single use plastic and disposables– e.g. our water cups are now paper
- Where possible we try to repair rather than replace
- Communicate what we are doing through our website and newsletter

Lifestyle Category

- Share advice for a more sustainable lifestyle pew leaflet has a weekly eco tip
- We've created an Eco section on the church website and a quarterly newsletter with tips and advice
- Installed a bike rack to encourage members to cycle
- Promote Second-hand September
- Promote the use of JE app to save energy
- Encourage members to nurture their own gardens and enjoy nature
